Quicken for Windows Conversion Instructions

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Introduction

As *St. Paul Federal Credit Union* completes its system conversion to our new *eBanking Service,* you will need to modify your Quicken settings to ensure the smooth transition of your data. To complete these instructions, you will need your login credentials for the *St. Paul Federal Credit Union* website.

It is important that you perform the following instructions exactly as described and in the order presented. If you do not, your service may stop functioning properly. This conversion should take 15–30 minutes.

NOTE: This update is time sensitive and can be completed on or after **07/15/2014 but before 8/20/2014.**

Documentation and Procedures

Task 1: Conversion Preparation

- Backup your data file. For instructions to back up your data file, choose Help menu > Search. Search for *Backing Up Your Data* and follow the instructions.
- Download the latest Quicken Update. For instructions to download an update, choose Help menu > Search. Search for *Checking for Updates to Quicken* and follow the instructions.

Task 2: Connect to St. Paul Federal Credit Union

- 3. Log in to **St. Paul Federal Credit Union** web site at <u>www.stpaulfcu.org</u>. Download your transactions into Quicken.
- 4. Once the transactions are downloaded, accept all transactions into your Quicken account register.
- 5. Repeat this step for each account (such as checking, savings, credit cards, and brokerage) that you use for online banking or investing.

Task 3: Deactivate Your Account(s) with St. Paul Federal Credit Union Internet Banking (Old System)

- 1. Choose **Tools** menu > **Account List**.
- 2. Click the **Edit** or **Edit Details** button of the account you want to deactivate.
- 3. In the Account Details dialog, click on the Online Services tab.
- 4. Click **Deactivate** or **Remove from One Step Update**. Follow the prompts to confirm the deactivation.

NOTE: The name of the buttons referenced above may vary depending on the services and the version of Quicken you are using.

- 5. Click on the **General or General Information** tab. Remove the **Account Number**.
- 6. Remove the name of the **Financial Institution**. Click **OK** to close the window.
- 7. Repeat steps 2–6 for each account with Internet Banking.

Task 4: Re-activate Your Account(s) with St. Paul Federal Credit Union eBanking (New System)

- 1. Log in to St. Paul Federal Credit Union web site at www.stpaulfcu.org.
- 2. Download and import your transactions to Quicken.
- Ensure you associate the account to the appropriate account already listed in Quicken. You will want to select Link to an existing account or Use an Existing Quicken account and select the matching account in the drop-down menu.

IMPORTANT:Do NOT select Create a new account or Create a new
Quicken account. If you are presented with accounts you do
not want to track in this data file, select Ignore - Don't
Download into Quicken or click the Cancel button.

4. Repeat steps 2 – 3 for all of your accounts
